Call for Papers

The *Journal of Transdisciplinary Peace Praxis* (hereafter *JTPP*) is published twice a year in February and August and accepts papers continuously throughout the year. Manuscripts up to 9,000 words in total, with a clear relevance to cutting-edge research and practice on subjects related to human social flourishing and peace, and not submitted to other publications, are always welcome.

We also welcome shorter thought pieces and opinion editorials (op-eds) between 1,000 and 2,500 words that raise rational arguments and engage conflict researchers, activists, and practitioners to explore under-addressed, or under-acknowledged, realities of peace praxis for our *Response and Reflection (R&R)* section.

Book reviews of between 750 and 1200 words are also accepted for appropriate books published within the last two years. For a list of possible books to review, feel free to email us at the submissions address below.

The realisation of nonviolent peaceful futures calls for collaborative exploration of the complex social and cultural resources, identities, and power dynamics of groups in conflict. The world's 'wicked problems' (e.g., environmental degradation, war, injustice, inequality, dehumanisation, and discrimination) are the currency of the *JTPP*. No single field or discipline is capable of creating singular understanding of these multifaceted social-cultural phenomena and their complex interrelationships.

We believe that interdisciplinary field of Peace and Conflict Studies is well placed to both explore and articulate the change we need. To understand such contexts of social conflict and change, *JTPP* aims to create both interdisciplinary and transdisciplinary spaces to discuss and analyse the diverse realities of nonviolent sustainable systems and their unique futures.

We are now accepting submissions for our **Seventeenth Issue (Vol. 9, No. 1)** and welcome *R&R* content, book reviews, and articles related to peace, social conflict, and human flourishing. Articles and reflective pieces that clearly embrace transdisciplinary methodology and embrace under-addressed concepts and neglected world regions will be privileged by the editorial team.

Prospective authors are encouraged to send us a 250-word abstract of your proposed article/contribution before 24 March 2026, for the current issue. Shorter submission for the *R&R* section or book reviews must be received one month before the date of publication for inclusion in the current issue.

You are encouraged to send us a 250-word abstract of your proposed manuscript contribution before abstract deadline for either the Winter or Fall issue for full consideration. We will convey our decision within 7 days of submission, and the complete manuscript (6,000 to 9,000 words) is required to be received latest on or before the final paper submission deadline, allowing adequate time for peer review process.
